A Good Life Ended.
Death of Mr. William Bradshaw, of Placentia.

On May 18th, 1898, there passed peacefully from this life at his residence Jersey Side, Great Placentia, Mr. William Bradshaw aged 58 years. His death was caused by a heavy cold which resulted in congestion of the lungs. Mr. Bradshaw was a member of one of our oldest and most respected Newfoundland families, - the Bradshaws of Placentia. His father held the position of Collector of Customs for many years. The surviving members of the family, besides his wife and children are, Messrs. John Bradshaw, Albert Bradshaw M.H.A. Richard Bradshaw, Collector at Gaultois, Miss Bradshaw and Mrs. Kelligrew. The deceased had entered largely into the supplying business, and kept a fleet of vessels at the Bank Fishery, while that branch of the fishery was in full operation. Of late he was interested in factories and milling enterprises. Full of energy, he never knew what it was to spend an idle moment and the hum of business was always kept up on his premises. In social life this genial kindly man ever made him a universal favourite and he has left behind him a record of private charity of the heroic type. The sick and the poor ever found him a friend in need. He sought out all the distress in his vicinity and gave relief. He was most generous supporter of the R.C. Church, of Placentia, giving liberally towards it on all occasions. He was also a staunch friend of the Presentation Convent of the place, ever assisting the nuns by hand and purse. Mr. Bradshaw was a member of the Church of England, and a man of deep religious earnestness. He sleeps among his kindred, beneath the shadow of the venerable Anglican Church, and whether we regard him as a promoter of industry, a loyal hearted friend, or a good and true man, Placentia will long hold dear and cherish the memory of William Bradshaw. To his wife and children, his brothers and sisters, we beg to convey our heartfelt sympathy in their sad bereavement.

1880. December 29th, at Placentia Mrs. Bradshaw relict of late William Bradshaw, Sub Collector, Mrs. Bradshaw was ever remarkable for her charity to the poor, and for her genial and generous disposition. Firm and sincere in her religious views, she was ever tolerant of the opinions of others, piety, with a calm and peaceful trust in a Merciful Redeemer was her habit of life, her long illness was borne with christian patience and fortitude, and when the end came, without a struggle, but as a child in its mother's arms, she fell asleep, loved ones near could not realize that she was dead, but time had ceased for their fond mother, her spirit was with God.

1860, at Placentia, Died on 12th November, aged 23, Mary Frances, third daughter.

1862, October 28th, at Burin at the residence of the Bride's father by Rvd. J. Cullen, William Bradshaw, Sub Collector at Placentia to Margaret Monahan, eldest daughter of Clement Benning, J.P. Lemaline.

1868, At Placentia, September 1st after a long illness, Juliana, daughter of Doctor Bradshaw.

1868. At Great Placentia, October 11th, after a long illness, Ellen Power, wife of Captain Francis Bradshaw, and third daughter of William Hooper (late) Magistrate Burin.

1868, June 10th, At Great Placentia, by Rvd. E. Condon, Mathew Davon of Boston, Telegrapher, New York Newfoundland and London Telegraph Co. to Margaret relict of late William Bradshaw, and daughter of late Clement Benning, J.P. Burin.

1853. September, at Placentia, by Rvd. E. Condon, Miss Ann Bradshaw to Captain W. Siteman, Ship Harbour, N.S.

1873 March 9th at Great Placentia, after a short illness in the 75th year of his age, F.L. Bradshaw, M.D. and Stipendiary Magistrate of that place.

1873. January 6th. At Placentia, George Second son of Doctor Bradshaw, aged thirty-five.

1831, August 1st. At Burin by Rvd. Mr. Smithies, Wesleyan Missionary, Doctor Bradshaw, Placentia, to Hannah daughter of the late William Phipard of St. Mary's.

1837. Married at Little Placentia, on December 12th, 1837, by W.G. Bradshaw, Licensed Magistrate, Josiah Blackburn of Great Placentia, to Mary Waldren Tucker, of Poole, Dorsetshire, now of Little Placentia.

1847 His Excellency the Governor, has been pleased to appoint Wm. G. Bradshaw, to be Notary Public for the Southern District of this Colony. Christopher Ayre, Pro Secretary.

1856. James Bradshaw, appointed Preventive Officer, of Customs Oderin July 14th 1856.

1863 -- January 19th 1863, aged 31, William Bradshaw, Sub Collector of H.M. Customs, Great Placentia.

1859. April 6th. His Excellency has been pleased to appoint William Bradshaw, to be Sub Collector at Placentia, in room of James B. Sawyer deceased.

1862. On May 25th 1862. Married by Burin by Rvd. Mr. Rozier, Captain Francis Bradshaw, Brigantine Magic to Ellen Power, daughter of Wm. Hooper Magistrate.

1863. On 4th July, the Wife of Capt. Francis Bradshaw of

1858. At Placentia, June 26th, Wilson, youngest son of the late W.G. Bradshaw, aged 15 years.
