FIRST CONNECTION WITH NEWFOUNDLAND.

David Burry

1767 Describing himself as a Mariner of Poolø owed Captain George Ryder 2 pounds the cost of a passage home from Newfoundland on Ryder's sloop Betsey.

1775 Built a fishing room at Greenspond, Bonavista Bay and took up permanent residence in Newfoundland.
The family were of the "Middle Class" - describing themselves as "Planters". The "Planter" was the organiser of the fishery. He owned the "fishing room" and a fishing boat or boats and hired servants to work for him. In turn he obtained his supplies and sold his catch to a Merchant - the merchants were top men on the Newfoundland totem pole.

By the 1840's there were several adult male Burry's around in the Bonavista Bay area.

THOMAS BURRY

1805 Thomas owned a fishing room on Newell's Island, Bonavista Bay. This room had been built by his father (David or Benjamin .?)

1815 Thomas and Mary had children, Mary, John, Giles and Sarah baptised in Greenspond Anglican Church.

1830 No less than three THOMAS'S baptised -
Thomas baptised aged 77
Thomas baptised aged 20
Thomas baptised aged 13
Thomas baptised aged 20.

In 1819 Thomas, James and John, Greenspond Planters, registered a schooner the Thomas and Charlotte, of which James was Master.

This vessel may well have been named after Thomas (age 77?) and his wife Charlotte?

1843 One Thomas of Hampshire Dorset married Sarah Ralph of Port de Grave, at Greenspond. Relationship to the others unknown.
