1744 ISAAC son of Richard baptised at St Saviours DARTMOUTH

1752 ISAAC and Elizabeth had a son Isaac baptised
at Dartmouth St Saviours.

1752 ~~1752~~ ISAAC of Dartmouth master of the GREYHOUND 50 tons
and a crew of 7 men. voyage from Dartmouth to
Newfoundland and thence with codfish to the Mediterranean

1754 appointed commander of the LONDON of London
60 tons and 6 men. voyage from London to Newfoundland
and the Mediterranean

1755 February. again commanded the same. voyage from
London to Newfoundland.

variously as 176 as 1762-1766 a seaman in Dartmouth
PLACE OF BIRTH given as New ton Abbott Devonshire

March-December seaman on the LIVELY of Dartmouth
a Newfoundland "Banker"., Discharged in Dartmouth
(In 1788 had served on another banker the CAPLI N BAY

1790 October- January 1791. AT ST JOHNS Nfld, signed
on the HOOKS AND LINES a dartmouth Fishing vessel.

~~1791~~ Discharged Dartmouth in January 1791. Had spent the
summer working as a fisherman in the inshore boats
at St Johns.

1791 ~~1792~~ March-October. seaman on the DISPATCH a banker of
Dartmouth. Discharged in St Johns.

1792 February-October. seaman on the DISPATCH (owned by
ROBERT NEWMAN and Company of Dartmouth- a banking
vessel. DISCHARGED ST LAWRENCE NEWFOUNDLAND.

1803 July ISAAC a pauper buried at St saviours in Dartmouth

1809 November ISAAC died at St Savkours parish Dartmouth
aged 65.
