# THOMAS FOOT

1801 and 1802 BT 167 Thomas of Teignton crew member on INDUSTRY and DEVONSHIRE. Both vessels were captained by Robert Gilpin and owned by Warren and Sons. This could ve the Warren and Sons who owned and occupied a fishing premises at Old Perlican Trinity Bay. (Trinity Census 1800-01)

## THOMAS FOOT

- 1774 Colonial Records. Thomas of Newton Abbott, Woolborough Parish now of St. John's, Boatkeeper. owes £403 to Henry Sparkes. Sells his plantation.
- 1775 He occupies another plantation at St. John's, owned by Sparkes.
- Thomas and John of Newton Bushell, boat keepers, at St. John's.
- 1787 Harbour Grace minute book. Thomas received wages from Herring and Scott.
- 1799 Thomas of Bishops Teignton mate on Brig HEBE of Teignmouth discharged in Nfld.

### ROBERT FOOT

 $\overline{1801}$  Newman journal Robert hired for RN at Sturminister last spring.

### JOHN FOOT

- 1774 Colonial Records, John of Newton Abbott(check Bushell) has plant in St. John's, next to Thomas, above. Falling in decay also at St. John's,
- 1813 John and Sons, shoemakers, dissolves.
- 1815 John Junior, butcher, dissolves.
- 1826 CO 194/ JOhn of Riverhead, landowner and farmer anti-local government/
- 1852 Gazette, John Foote Merchant of Burnt Island Exploits, died age 55.
- 1806 BT98/10 John age 60 of Ashburton on SPECULATOR owned by Richard Bulley -see attached- Newfoundland ship. Discharged at Lisbon wounded by Portuguese.

- 1767 Colonial Records. John Foote Junior crew on fishing voyage (18 men) employed by John Gale. Gale was a St. John's merchant and therefore presume this is the Newton Abbott John.
- 1637 Port Books. John master of ELIZABETH, owner John Hilgrove, Dartmouth, Jersey, Nfld. Fishery.
- 1787 Lester Diary. Mr. John Foote elected town clerk at Poole,
  Dorset. Lester was Mayor of Poole and in the Newfoundland
  trade with business establishment at Trinity. Foot was politically
  opposed to Lester.
- 1748 John Foot at Fogo seaman for Slade and Company.
- 1806 BT167/38 John of Denbury crew on UNITY Newfoundland ship, Captain S. Burn.
- 1808 Trinity Anglican John of Brockness Hants, Married Ann Ryan of Trinity.

#### HENRY FOOT

1835 ST. Thomas Anglican
Henry and Ann of Long Island, Fortune Bay had d. Sarah, 21,
Mary 10, Elinor, 7.

### JAMES FOOT

1849 James late of Ashburton married Catherine Foot of St. John's.

### WILLIAM FOOT

- 1793 William of Ashburton age 26 on HMS Bellona.
- 1833 St. John's, Anglican, William of Ashburton died age 25.
- 1809 St. John's Congregational William m. Frances Brown. Had son John, 1810, daughter Elizabeth 1812.
- 1812 Supreme Court, William on jury 11 Aug. 12 Sept.
- 1812 William, merchant, petitioned against rum duty.
- 1790's Newman Journal. William received bills from Robert Newman at Little Bay (Long Island, NW of Hermitage).

### NICHOLAS FOOT

- 1763 Nicholas of Sturminister Newton apprenticed to Thomas Kate Mariner in Newfoundland Trade.
- 1808 Nicholas at Trinity
- 1800-01 Nicholas own house in Old Perlican.
- 1823 Nicholas crew on PROVIDENCE Brig in Newfoundland trade. Owners Cadner and Co.

1815 Burin Court Book Charles Foot sued George Power, Wm. Dwyer, John Phelan, for taking away his boat from Ryan/Morris Wharf.
