2 WILLIAM LUTIM

The Charles Hillier listed at Lamaline in 1825 was my great grand-father who settled there in 1824 and married Mary Pitman daughter of William and Mary Pitman. Her father was an Englishman, one of two who settled there in the 1790's. The first Hillier recorded at Lamaline was John who it appears settled there 1810-12. Whether John and Charles were brothers I do not know but no doubt they came from the same area in England. It appears they were the only two Hilliers to settle there as I have traced all the branches of the family from them including Thomas son of John who was the first Hillier to settle in Brunette (Island) After considerable searching I have not been able to determine their birthplace which I feel was in Dorset. One thing I would like to point out is the reference to Emmanuel Hillier of Point Aux Gaul in Professor Searys book. Emmanuel was a son of John and Deborah and did not come from France as indicated.

Another son went to Bonne Bay and was apparently the forerunner of the Bonne Bay Caines. This has been confirmed by contacts we have made over the years with Caines from that area.
