 ated in Catalina aforesaid, commonly known by the
 name of Gold mine above plantation now in my
 possession, consisting of Dwelling House, Stage, Flakes,
 Cook room, and building thereon of every description
 together with all Gardens, meadows, and Grounds there
 belonging or appertaining, bounded on the North
 East by the Brook which separates Edward Hiscock's
 Room, and on the South West by a Brook that sepa-
 rates my said Room from unoccupied ground,
 also all the Tools, Craft, and utensils particularly
 enumerated at the foot hereof, unto the said Alexander
 Thomson & Co, or their assigns for their proper use and
 benefit, with liberty to sell and dispose of the same,
 and to ...
