

OBITS, son of Ezer Minter of Newfoundland, md 1672 died 1673

Tristram his relict in 1674 married Joshua Baker (this is in conflict with several records)

Rebecca, dau of James Bemas, md 3 Apr 1672 Tobias Minter, an emigrant from Newfoundland and had a son Tobias Minter who was b. 26 Feb 1673/4. Her husband died probably at sea and she married 17 June 1674 John Diamond.

Joshua Baker, son of Alexander Baker of Boston, was born in Boston. Joshua came to New London about 1670 and married 13 Sept 1674 Hannah the widow of Tristram Minter.

MENTER, Tobias Jr.

8 June 1694 for 50 lbs sold to John Coite of Killingly, 6 to 7 acres in New London given to me by my grandfather James Bemas, deceased. This land afterward belonged to Mr John Pickett deceased; land adjoining Robert Hempstead

This land did belong to my honored Uncle John Mentor, late of Killingworth-----all my right to land that that joins Lieut Joseph Willcocks land which is commonly called "Bushy Place"
