 Munday of Old Perlican in the Island of
 Newfoundland, being weak of body but of
 perfect mind and memory blessed be Almighty
 God for the same, do make and Publish this my
 last will and testament in manner and form
 following. That is to say I give and bequeath
 unto John Collins of the said Old Perlican a
 piece of ground situated in the said Old Per-
 lican and bounded and situated on one side
 By Mr. W^m Green to the Northeast and the
 Church and Grave yard to the South West,
 and also give and bequeath unto the said John
 Collins all that I possess and my effects what
 kind soever it maybe to one farthing after my
 funeral charges. And I do likewise appoint the
 said John Collins to direct and manage the
 same to his own discretion - and I do hereby con-
 stitute and appoint Mr. James Barrett
 Senior an inhabitant of the said Old Perlican
 and Mr. Richard Norraps Executors of this my last
 will and Testament hereby revoking all pro-
 mises and former wills made by me. In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal at
 Old Perlican in the Island of Newfoundland
 this fifteenth day of September in the year of our
 Lord One Thousand eight hundred and twenty-
 one. Signed, Sealed, Published and declared
 by the above named William ^{his} Munday
 to be his last will and Testament ^{Mark} in the presence
