Dear Mrs. Johns,

Thank you for your letter and the interesting document regarding James Murphy, your paternal great, great, grandfather.

There were Murphys in Newfoundland for most of the 18th century, particularly in St. John's and the nearby Ferryland and Conception Bay areas. The additional information you have sent us is most helpful. You say it is believed he was born in 1756 in Co. Wicklow, Ireland; that he was press-ganged onto a British Man-o-War. If you have fairly firm evidence for this, we have no reason to question it. We have found in our records, however, a James Murphy, son of William and Bridget Murphy of St. John's, baptised in the Anglican Church, St. John's, in Nov. He was probably born a year or so earlier - children were not usually baptised immediately after birth then. This may be simply a coincidence, but it would be more in character with the general description of the 'employees' who made up the Newfoundland Militia (see enclosed photocopies). The impression given is that the men were local, many former Public Works employees, and while possibly coerced into service, they still had enough local clout to grumble and put up resistance. It is doubtful any were press-ganged into this militia. Private Snooks, for instance, "buried without military honours' (P. 20) was a local St. John's

We have found the baptismal date for your great, great, great grandmother. Margaret Pottle, the daughter of Joseph and Elizabeth Pottle, St. John's, was baptised (Anglican) in May 1764. She was born in St. John's and of Dorset descent - through her father's family at least - we do not know Elizabeth's maiden name, but its undoubtedly Westcountry with that Christian name.

We have no record of either of Margaret's St. John's marriages. She would have been 33 or 34, and a widow of Carroll (not Carl), at the time of her marriage to James Murphy.

With regard to Murphy's petition, there is little reason to doubt it is not factual, even though he gave these details to Price nearly forty yrs after they happened. The petition,

written in a 19th century narrative style, is pruned of all information not relevant to Murphy obtaining his pension. If you re-read the petition and study the photocopies, you will see that the two items fit together like a transparent overlay map, each supporting the skeletal outlines of the other. Murphy was a member of the Newfoundland Regiment of Foot (1780-83) - a militia, not British regulars. While primarily a defense force, he could say with all honesty that he was a veteran of the American Revolution. He probably remained in Newfoundland for some years - he was in a good position to obtain government (ordinance) work. In his petition, he reticently states, "I did actually reside in this Province (New Brunswick) at the time of the passing of (the) act," (2 Vic) in 1839.

New Brunswick Blue books - small ledger-type vols. sent annually to the Colonial Office giving information regarding costs of government, revenues, land sales, etc., carried an item regarding pensions paid to veterans of the American Revolution and their widows. No names were given, only aggregate figures (400-500) at so many pounds, total. The pensions amounted to eight to ten pounds per annum. This was probably paid by the British government rather than the colony of New Brunswick.
