HISTORY OF THE CASE FAMILY  
as recalled and told by  
Samuel Amos Case 1965

Ananias Case was born in the Dover, England area around 1800. About 1815, he migrated to Newfoundland as an apprentice clerk for the Robert Pack & Co. of England to their Carbonear office. When the company closed down, he moved to Salmon Cove. While there, he married Eliza Rose and had 3 children by her; James, John & Eliza. His wife Eliza died and he married Grace Buddon of Ferry's Cove. They had 4 children; Jane, Bella, Samuel and Thomas. He acquired some land (about 15-20 acres), the 'sands' and to the top of the hill across the gut, where he built a house. He raised the necessary animals and vegetables to keep his family in food including meat, eggs, milk, etc. Later, he moved his family to Hearts Delight and accepted a position as school teacher, which position he held until his death at age 55. He is buried in the cemetery at Hearts Delight, Trinity Bay. His second wife is buried there beside him and his first wife is buried in the Church of England cemetery at Carbonear.

James, oldest son of Ananias, married Dorcas Judson, daughter of Joseph Judson of Flathead. In 1852, James built a house in Flathead, Otterbury and their 11 children were born there. Their children were named; Vicory Judson, Mary Grace, Phobe Jane I, Edgar, John William, George, James I, James II, Phobe Jane II, Elizabeth Ann, & Samuel Amos, (the sole survivor of these children and narrator of this record). In 1883, James moved his family to Salmon Cove and built a house on part of his fathers old farm (he converted the old farm house his father built over half a century before, into a barn). His son Vicory had already built a house on part of the old farm and later, James other sons, as they married also built houses on other parts of the farm.

Ananias son John went to sea from Harbor Grace and when the ship landed at Liverpool, he jumped ship and has never been heard from since.

Ananias daughter Eliza, married John Antle. They had 3 sons; Joshua, John, name unknown. She is buried in Victoria.

Ananias daughter Jane married George Crocker and they had 4 sons; John, Samuel, Joseph and Ananias. She is buried at Hearts Delight.

Ananias daughter Bella married John Crocker (brother to George) and they had 3 children; Stephen Henry, Achilles, & Victoria. She is buried at Hearts Delight.

Ananias son Samuel married Naomi Hopkins and they had 2 children; Arthur and Jessie. At a later date, Samuel & Naomi migrated to Boston, Mass and they are buried in Woodlawn Cemetery, Everett, Mass.

Ananias son Thomas married Elizabeth Parsons and they had one son; Albert. Thomas is buried in Hearts Delight.

This concludes the history of Ananias Case, his wives and their children.

Joseph Judson was born in Dover, England and came to Newfoundland as an apprentice clerk in the office of the Robert Pack & Co. at their Carbonear branch. When the company closed down, he moved to Flathead, Otterbury and built a "fishing room". This "fishing room" was the name given the preparation area for the cutting, salting and drying of the fish prior to shipment to England and other parts of the world. While as a clerk of the Pack company, he married Susanna Harvey, daughter of William Harvey of Freshwater. They had 6 children; Jane, Anna, Susanna, Elizabeth, John & Dorcas, all born in Flathead, Otterbury. In later years he retired from the fishing industry and taught school in Otterbury. He used to cash his teaching checks before he went home so he could keep some of his wages at the school. This money he used to buy food and clothing for the poor. He also filled in as a minister for the local Methodist Church. He was held in very high esteem by all who know him. Joseph died in 1885 at the age of 98 and is buried in the Freshwater cemetery ~~at Blow-He-Down~~ beside his wife who died about 10 years earlier.

Joseph's daughter Jane married Thomas Rose and had 2 children by him; John, and Mary Ann. Jane is buried in Salmon Cove.

Joseph's daughter Anna married John Moores and they had 3 children; John, Harry & Lottie. Anna is buried in Freshwater.

Joseph's daughter Susanna married George Vacher and they had 5 children; John, Jemima, Sarah & Cicely. Susanna is buried in Carbenear.

Joseph's son John died at an early age and is buried in Freshwater.

Joseph's daughter Elizabeth was married twice. She was first married to John Butt and had 2 children by him; Jesse and John. Her second husband was Patrick Kirby and they had 5 children; Susanna, Elizabeth, John Joseph and Eli. She is buried in Freshwater.

Joseph's daughter Dorcas married James Case, son of Ananias Case and the history of their union is as recorded on page one of this record.

The preceding accounts record the marriages and burial places of the children of Ananias Case and Joseph Judson and show how the two families became related. It also gives the names of the grandchildren of Ananias and Joseph. The following is an account of only the descendants of Dorcas Judson Case and James Case.

Vicory, son of James, was married three times. His first wife was Mary Ann Slade and they had 2 children; Jesse & Jane. His second wife was Jane Butt and he had 6 children by her; William, Samuel, Edgar, Ann, George & Rheda. His third wife was Eliza Jane King and they had no children. Vicory is buried in Salmon Cove beside his three wives.

Mary Grace, daughter of James, married Joshua Ponny and they had 3 children; Edgar, Phobe Jane, & Trythema. Mary Grace and her husband are buried in Salmon Cove.

Phobe Jane I, daughter of James, died when she was 19 years old and was never married. She is buried in Freshwater.

Edgar, son of James, married Ellen Butt and they had 7 children; Amos, George, Rhoda, John William, Heddley, Aubrey and Elizabeth Ann. Edgar is buried with his wife in Salmon Cove.

John William, son of James, was married to Emma Budden and they had 5 children; James, Phobe & Sandy. John William and his wife are buried in Salmon Cove.

George, son of James, married Julia Ann Clark and they had 7 children; Herbert, James, Donald, Jessie, William, Effie and Emmie. George and his wife are buried in Salmon Cove.

James I, son of James, died at 9 months and is buried in Freshwater.

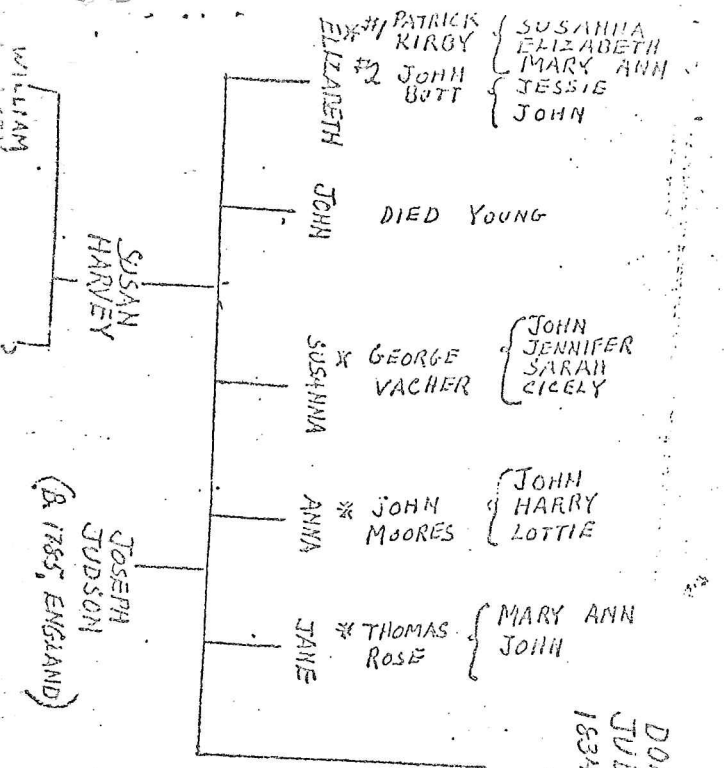
James II, son of James, died when 14 years old and is buried in Salmon Cove.

Phobe Jane II, daughter of James, after her marriage to Albert Parsons, moved to Perry's Cove. They had 4 children; William, Robert James, George and Winnie. Phobe Jane II is buried in Perry's Cove and Albert remarried.

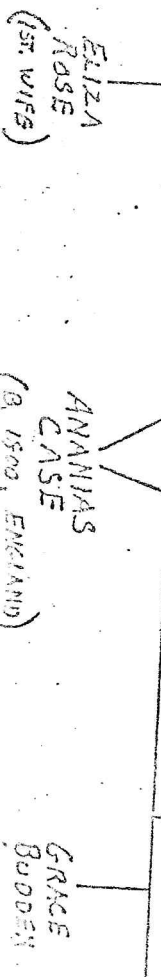
Elizabeth Ann, daughter of James, after her marriage to John Thistle, moved to Mulley's Cove and they had one daughter; Susanna. Elizabeth is buried at Black Head. John remarried and is buried at Black Head too.

Samuel Amos, son of James, married Mabre Parsons and they had 7 children; William James who lived only 2 yrs. 4 mos., Clyde Lench & Fredorick William Bemister (twins), Eric Bertram, Dorcas Viola, Elizabeth Irene, and Wallace Roy. Except for William James (who is buried in Salmon Cove), the others are now living around Boston in the United States.

This ends the record of the third generation and that only of the decendents of Dorcas Judson Case and James Case. The following will be the record of the decendents of Samuel Case and Magre Parsons Case only.

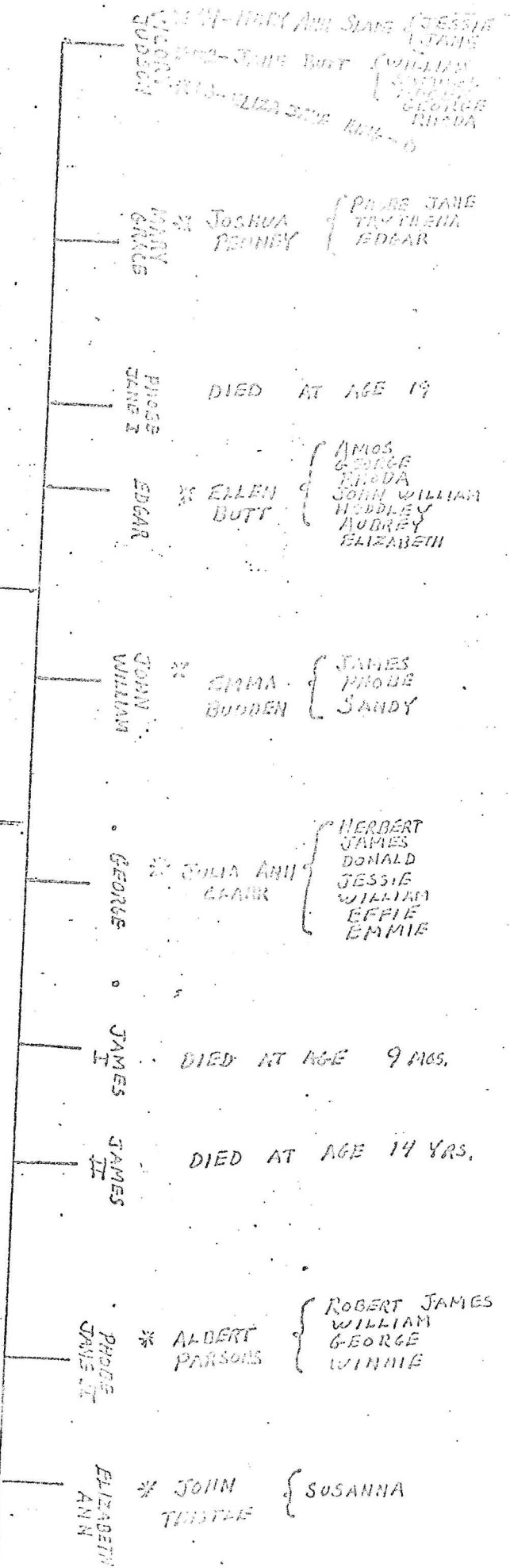
