



Bennett, who ran for Prime Minister in 1923 and who was defeated; was offered Leadership of the Opposition after General Elections, 1923, but preferred to remain a supporter of Mr. W. J. Higgins, who came next in turn; resigned in August, three months after his return. Married Gertrude C. daughter of the late Capt.
