(x) Order by Governor Clinton to the Fishing Admirals at Fermouse, 18th September 1731.

Having considered the affair between Charles Humphreys and Company and George Coplestone, relating to a parcel of fish the latter bought of the former. Orders Coplestone to pay for whatever part thereof he received on board, according to the contract price.

This is probably the George Copleston who married Sarah Prust at Bideford on 16th January, 1722, both being of that town.

Nathaniel Cock, ordained 24th October, 1716 at The Great Meeting House, Bideford, entered the baptism by him of Christopher, son of Goorge and Sarah, May 22nd 1728 "at home". (Born April 27th).

Mr. and Mrs. George Copleston were listed as subscribers at The Great Meeting House in 1726, 1729 and 1730 - £1.1s and 8s.
