1694 December James son of James buried St saviours Dartmouth
- 1717 James of Brixham devonshire buried  
1821 James aged 13 of Brixham apprentice on the Fancy  
of B rixham, Jeremiah crews master  
1822-3. continues as apprentice on the same.
- 1739 James son of John and Elizabeth baptised PAINGTON Devon  
1741 he was buried  
1772 James son of John and Ann baptised PAINTON Devon
- 1662 James son of Richard and Elizabeth baptised TOPSHAM Devon  
1664/5 he was buried
- 1755 James son of Edward baptised at LYMPSTONE devon  
ed  
1802 James of Topsham devon seaman on the FLORA William Tickell  
master
- 168 3 James, master of the William & Ann of Exeter a small  
vessel in the northern european trades
- 1809 (CROW) James master of the POLLY brig of Newfoundland  
7 4 tons and 4 man crew owned by B Ferris and Company.  
9 November arrived at Newfou-ndland from Boston USA  
18 November took fish from Newfoundland to Alicante  
in 15 July cleared from Barbados to Newfoundland  
14 august ~~sailed with~~ arrived Barbados from Newfoundland  
with 670 quintals of cod fish
- 1821 JAMES seaman on the FLORA of Poole . a Newfoundland  
trader owned by the firm of Slade and Company of Poole
- 1830 ! September he a seaman on their BROTHERS - deserted  
at Battle Harbor Labrador.
- 1802 JAMES signed on as a servant to Robert Newman and  
Company. Was enlisted in a Public House at Ashburton  
Devonshire. in March. in June sailed to Newmans  
Establishment at St Lawrence in Newfoundland
- 1809 a Bill of exchange paid to him by Newmans,s agent  
at st Lawrence, william Woolcot, for L20 was paid to  
him in Dartmouth by Robert Newman and Company.
