>Thank you for taking the time to reply to my question, and please accept
my apologies for being so slow in answering. The information I have
regarding John Garland comes from the following sources:

>My original information came from a Family Group Sheet from a distant relative and I have been trying to find sources to document the information she gave me. She was not interested in providing more information than was on the Family Group Sheet. Her interest was in the William Luscomb (many variant spellings) line, but she does list Jane Garland's parents as John Garland and Frances Earle. The children of William Luscomb and Jane Garland are as follows:

>[I have not found a record of marriage, which apparently is not unusual for marriages before 1700. The births are also recorded in the Salem Vital Records, along with the early deaths of two of the children:

>Salem Vital Records, Deaths, pp. 405, 410-11

>Luscomb, Frances, d. William and Jane, Sept. 15, 1707

>Luscomb, W[illia]m, s. William and Jane, Mar 5, 1709-10

>There is one Garland marriage in Salem, that of a Katharin or Katherine Garland, to a Nehemiah Jewett of Ipswich on 8 December 1709, but no indication of who her parents are.]

>

>I also received some anecdotal information from another distant relative, and to be honest, I have given up asking for sources, as this seems to infuriate any number of people. Since I wrote asking for your suggestions, I have found one more source of information, some of which now looks rather suspect, especially the mention of "other daughters". One the other hand, the reference to correspondence with Judge Prowse is quite interesting. It is:

>Boston Evening Transcript News Clippings, 12 August 1903 , Genealogical Note #455.

>Garland. In Salem Court Records there is a John Garland, called of Salem, administration to son-in-law, Mr. William Luscombe, and wife Jane, child of Mr. John Garland, formerly of Newfoundland, late of Salem, deceased at date, Sept. 18, 1706 [nb - this is wrong]. The inventory mentions £50 in clothing, a little furniture, perhaps of a room in son's house, and £33 cash. Money in Newfoundland and England unknown, named in the account given April 4, 1709. This seems to be a trader, and perhaps proprietor, driven from Newfoundland about 1700, during the French raids. Some correspondence with Judge Prowse confirms the theory that his wife was an Earle with relatives in Boston (perhaps Henry of Isle of Shoals, and Robert Earle of Boston, who married Henry Rust's daughter Hannah and owned the "Seven Stars" Tavern on Bishop's Lane in 1698). William and Jane Luscombe name a daughter Frances as well as a son John, and John, this son, married Mary Earle of Boston of the Robert Earle line, in his turn.

> In Boston records are several individuals of name of Garland not annexed by the Garland historian that I feel sure are the other children of our trader of Salem. Frances named by Wyman, who married John Phillips, mariner, in Boston, April 15, 1717, and died aged twenty-five, June 4, 1726.

> Sarah Garland married Thomas Goodyear Sept. 5, 1703. Elizabeth Garland married Benjamin Rolfe March 1, 1719. Jane produced her baptismal

certificate when she joined Salem church, as of Newfoundland. Chaplains of warships were the only clergymen allowed on the island at her date, so the records are with some society in England perhaps.

>>Thank you for your most interesting communication. Would it be possible to >>acquire a complete copy of the documentation you cite including evidence of >>the marriages of the daughters?

>>The Garland family is of considerable interest in Newfoundland being among >>one of the ten oldest patrilineal lines on the island.

>>A John Garland shows up in three 17th century censuses:

>>1675 John Garland and wife at Muskets Cove, Conception Bay (presently >>Bistols Hope) with 4 daughters, 10 men servants, 3 boats and 2 stages >>(fishing wharf-shed structure);

>>In 1676 at Musketto Bay (same place) Jon Garland & wif 4 children, 10 >>servants, 2 boats;

>>And in 1677 at Musketa Jno Garland & wife 1 son 4 dts 10 servants 18 >>cattle. (I believe the son was George from whom subsequent generations >>descend).

>>In addition to the above John Garland's signature occurs on a petition in >>1706 (related to assistance against French) and in the census of 1708 he >>appears as a resident of Little Belle Island (a refuge area for some during >>the war) with only three servants and one boat (no wife or children listed). >>Despite the bothersome details and inconsistencies (not unusual in trying >>to track early relatives), I believe your man is the same as that in >>Conception Bay 1675-1708 . Could Frances have been his wife too? Are second >>marriages involved?

>>I have not been able to link the Garlands of Conception Bay with those >>found in Trinity in the next century yet a family tradition maintains that >>there was.

>>>I am looking for information on a John Garland who died in Salem, >>>Massachusetts in August 1708 in his 77th year. According to the >>>(incomplete) probate records I have found in Essex County, MA, he was >>>recently from Newfoundland, and had "unknown" monies both there and in >>>England. His daughter, Jane (said to have been born about 1680), married >>>a William Luscumb of Salem.

>>>I was hoping to connect this John Garland to the John Garland who was in >>>the 1675 Census for Newfoundland, living in Conception Bay. However, >>>there are a few small details that are bothersome. His death, for >>>example, is possibly too early for the John Garland of Conception Bay >>>("Family Names of the Island of Newfoundland", by E.R.Seary has a John >>>Garland on Little Belle Island in 1708-09), and according to one

>>>undocumented source he had another daughter Frances who married a John
>>>Phillips in Boston, whereas the John Garland of Conception Bay had a
>>>daughter Frances who married John Earle. According to this source, both
>>>daughters Jane and Frances were refugees from the French War. (I'm still
>>>looking for documentation for this information.)

>>>In your book "Soe longe as there comes noe women", you make frequent
>>>reference to the Lester-Poole papers and to a Garland family from near
>>>Poole who were involved in trade to Trinity Bay, but at a somewhat later
>>>date. Part of my question is whether those papers included information
>>>about the Garland family from an earlier period, or if you can suggest
>>>any other sources that might provide further evidence to help resolve the
>>>questions about this/these John Garland(s).
