Articles of Marriage Contract made,
concluded and entered into this twenty-ninth day of
May, in the year of our Lord One Thousand eight
hundred and twenty one Between Mary Still,

widow of Charles Still late of Trinity in the Island
of Newfoundland, deceased of the one part, and Samuel
Garland late of Shipton George in the County of Dorset
in Great Britain, but now residing at Trinity in the
Island of Newfoundland of the other part —

Witnesseth that whereas a marriage is intended
to be shortly had and solemnized between the above
named Mary Still and Samuel Garland and as
the said Mary Still is possessed of certain property
in monies funded and unfunded, to the amount of
about Four hundred Pounds Sterling, more or less,
which she wishes to secure to herself and her offspring
both during her lifetime, and after the death of the said
Samuel Garland should he die before she — the said
parties do hereby, previous to the solemnization of
the said intended Marriage mutually bind each
other to the fulfilment of the following express condi-
tions, that is to say — First. That John Bringsby
Garland Merchant, and William Fornell Gentleman
both of the Town and County of Poole in the County of
Dorset in Great Britain shall be joint Trustees for
the said Samuel Garland and Mary his wife
(now Mary Still) and that the property in monies
funded and unfunded, now belonging to Mary Still
shall be invested in the Public Funds in the names
of the said John Bringsby Garland and William For-
nell for the uses herein after mentioned. —

Secondly. That after the solemnization of the said
intended marriage, and as long as the said Sam-
uel Garland and Mary his wife both shall live, that
the interest of the said monies (now belonging
to Mary Still) shall, through the intervention

of the said John Bringley Garland and William
Turnell, their heirs, executors, administrators and
assigns, be at the mutual disposal of the said
Samuel Garland and Mary his wife, for their own
use and benefit, and for that of their offspring by
the said marriage. Thirdly — That in case of
the death of the said Mary, the interest of the said
Funded Property, during the life-time of the said
Samuel Garland, shall through the intervention
of the said Trustees, their heirs, executors, adminis-
trators and assigns, be at his the said Samuel
Garland's disposal for his own use and benefit,
and for that of his offspring by the said marriage.
But in case the said Mary should die without
leaving any offspring, then, and in that case, not
only the Interest, but also the Principal, shall be
at his the said Samuel Garland's disposal for
his own use and benefit.

And lastly — That at the death of the said
Samuel Garland, if Mary his wife be still living,
the whole of the above mentioned funded property,
through the intervention of the said Trustees, &c.
shall revert back again to her the said Mary for
her own use and benefit and for that of her
offspring — but, should Mary his wife be
not then living, the whole of the Principal of the
above mentioned Funded Property shall be equally
divided between the Issue (if any) male or female, arising
from the said Marriage, share and share alike,
when they shall severally be married or attain
to the age of Twenty-one Years respectively.
