- 1797 Commander of the "JANE", a schooner of Bermuda 179 tons burthen, registered in 1796 and owned by Stowe and Company. Voyage to Barbados from St. Vincent.
- 2. 1798 Commander of the same vessel.
  Voyage to St. Vincent from Newfoundland.
- 3. 1804 Commander of the "DOVE".

  In May arrived at St. Vincent from Wilmington (USA).

  In September arrived at St. Vincent from Newfoundland.
- 4. 1807. Commander of the "THETIS", a 64 tons sloop owned by Stowe and Company.

In December took Newfoundland cod and staves from Bermuda to St. Vincent.

- 1808. Commander of same vessel. 3rd March arrives Bermuda from St. Vincent with rum.
  21st March takes Newfoundland cod, oil and staves to St. Vincent.
  26th May takes salt/onions from Bermuda to St. Vincent.
  7th May arrives at Bermuda from St. Croix with sugar.
  In September appointed to command the "ALERT" of Bermuda, a 102 ton schooner owned by Triminghams.
  Voyage Bermuda to Newfoundland in ballast.
- 1809. Commander of the same.

  12th October takes cod from Newfoundland to Bermuda.

On a voyage from Newfoundland to Bermuda was captured by the American Privateer "ALFRED". He and the crew were placed aboard an American merchant schooner which released them at Teneriffe on the 31st December.

1814. Again commands the "ALERT".

News in July that she had foundered off Bermuda in gale. The crew were saved.

September. Commander of the "LORD NELSON".

At Newfoundland from Bermuda.

1818. Commander of the "ST.VINCENT" owned by Trimingham.

October arrived at St. John's from Bermuda.

There is then a gap in my files until:-

- 1828. Still commander of the "ST.VINCENT".
  September arrived St.John's, Newfoundland from Berm uda.
  October took a cargo of fish to Jamaica.
- 1829. In April to St. John's from St. Vincent-in June took fish from St. John's to Demerara.
  In August arrived St. John's from Jamaica.
- 1830. 24th May arrived St. John's from St. Vincent.
  28th May took fish from St. John's to Barbados.
  26th October arrived St. John's from St. Vincent.
  15th November took fish from St. John's to Barbados.
- 1831. 16th April arrived St. John's from St. Vincent. 27th April took fish from St. John's to Barbados. 5th July arrived St. John's from St. Vincent. 11th July took fish from St. John's to Barbados.

DISAPPEARS FROM THE REGISTER and other sources thereafter. Probably retired?

WE THEN HAVE ANOTHER "WILLIAM" - an Englishman who does not appear to be connected with the above, although he too was a ship captain in the Newfoundland trade.

- 1830 Commander of the "FRIENDS" of Poole. Reported lost off the Canadian Coast.
- 1836 Commander of the "PORCIA" of London.
  167 tons burthen built Yarmouth, England in 1826 and owned by Mr. Melhuish of London.

October entered St. John's from London with a cargo for Lawrence O'Brien.

November takes a cargo of seal/cod oil to Bristol. No news of him or vessel until 1839.

January enters St. John's from Hamburg.

1841 October enters St. John's from London.

November takes fish from St. John's to Naples.

Continues in command of her, steadily employed in the Newfoundland trade until 1844.

- 1845. Commands her on voyages from London to the Mediterranean.
- 1846 Ceases to command her. No further information.

## Further comments:

I have no information concerning any Hatchard SETTLERS in Newfoundland before 1840, and could discover nothing in the records I consulted on any baptism in St. John's around 1850. It is quite possible that some record of this exists in one or other of the churches, etc. around the city, or of course in the outports where his father probably worked. However, searching of that sort could take months.

However, I can tell you a little bit about his Christian name. Not only was Malzard the Jersey surname, but Philip was almost certainly the name of the father of Philip Malzard Hutchings' wife. He was PHILIP Malzard, a Jersey ship's captain during the period up to 1830 at least.
