Dear Mrs. Schneider,

Thank you for your letter regarding the Rose, Snow and Rowe families of Newfoundland. As you know, our records cover primarily the period 1600-1840.

The Roses came from Dorset, from the Poole-Wareham area in the early 1700's, and later from the Sturminster Newton areas (1780's). While there were a few Rose families in Conception Bay and the north, they tended to settle on the south coast, particularly in Fortune Bay, George Rose was an early Grand Bank Methodist (1820-85). Others were:

- (1811) William served on the Fortune Bay Grand Jury
- (1807) Joshua worked for Mr. Evans, Fortune Bay
- (1835) Robert of Beloram, F.B., married Madlin Dolliment at St. John's (Anglican)
- (1835) James and Elizabeth of Hermitage, F.B. had son James, and 2 daughters, Eliz. and Ann.
- (1835) Robert and Ann, of Hermitage, had son John, age 11 years, baptized.
- (1794) William (not same as above) served in Placentia militia
- (1803) James and Robert Rose appointed Constables for Hermitage by St. John's Court.
- (1787-1867) Samuel died at Grand Bank, F.B. Most likely a former resident of Hr. Buffett.

In Conception Bay:

- (1815) James, Carbonear, married Ann White (Methodist)
- (1809) James, (another) Brigus, married Peggy Cole
