


From the Parish Register, St. Margaret's,

Buried 5 Aug 1791 Dugal Stewart
from St. John's Newfoundland
commander of the Schooner Endeavour
from Leghorn died on board the above
ship in Standgate Creek where she
had performed Quarantine from which
she had been discharged three days
previous to his death which was
declared by the Surgeon of the
Dictator Guardship to have happened
in consequence of an apoplectic fit.

Dear Sir,

I am sending a copy of an entry in the parish register of Lower Halstow, in Kent, in the hope that - if you have not seen it before - it may be of some interest.

I am prompted to send it by an article on the MHA in the latest issue of Family History News and Digest, written by Roberta Thomas.

Lower Halstow is situated at the head of a tidal inlet from the River Medway and its church the nearest to the former quarantine anchorage in Stangate (sic) Creek.

I am not myself researching Dugal Stewart, nor, at the moment, any aspect of maritime history - knowing how busy you must be I do not look for any acknowledgement of this letter.
