He is twenty-one years of age and upwards, was borned in Poddletown in the said county with his parents and lived there till he was fifteen or sixteen years old. During which time his father agreed with Francis William Hill of Poddletown, that the examinant should live with him as his plough boy for a year at the wages of two shillings a week, exclusive of his maintenance which his father provided for himself. He continued to work for his said master a whole year and upwards. He afterwards moved with his father to Alderson and there worked as a day labourer some times with his father and other times with Joseph Way. Afterwards lived at Wimborne Minster but not as a yearly servant, till he hired himself to go to Newfoundland for two summers and a winter in a service of Waldron and Young where he caught a valant chill in his right leg and has been very lame ever since. He returned from Newfoundland to Wimborne Minster the 9th of November 1792, where he has resided ever since.
