" 6<sup>th</sup> Blowing a nice Breeze but not quite as cold quite a few mummies around Syd & Randall. Hauled Snow. Garland Semons were here

- " 18<sup>th</sup> Fine day no news 19<sup>th</sup> Snowing went  
down to see Annie Bennett after tea
- " 20<sup>th</sup> Fine but cold went to church in the night
